OCR Level 1/2 Cambridge National Certificate in Health & Social Care

The Cambridge National in Health and Social Care introduces students to the specialist knowledge and skills needed to work in various health and social care settings. Underpinning the qualification is a focus on core values and communicating with individuals, to maintain their dignity and sense of being valued.

What will you study?

You will study essential values of care for use with individuals in a range of care settings. Different ways of communicating, working and supporting individuals and professionals within health, social care and early years settings. Also, the different careers pathways within the health, social care and early years settings.

Units we will cover:

R032: Principles of care in health and social care: In this unit, students will learn about the importance of the rights of service users, person-centred values and how to apply them.

R033: Supporting individuals through life events: In this unit, students will learn about life stages and the factors that affect them. They will understand expected and unexpected life events and the impact they will have on physical, social/emotional and socio-economic aspects in an individual's life.

R035: Health promotion campaigns: In this unit, students will have the opportunity to explore the various public health challenges the country faces, the approaches used to encourage health and wellbeing and the importance of this to society.
